## **Autumn Garden Visits**

Our Inland Autumn Garden visits are on Sunday, 13<sup>th</sup> April, leaving Dunedin at about 11am for 11.45am at **Philippa and Charles Reids' at Little Traquair, on SH87, Rpd 2000.** It is 10.5 km from Outram, and Philippa will put balloons at the turn off on the RHS of the highway. They built their house 22 years ago. Philippa was a landscape advisor then, so the garden was well planned and will be a treat for us to see now. **Bring your thermos, cups and picnic lunches here.** 

At 1.30pm, leave for Shepherds' taking care to take the right turnings to get to Mahinerangi. **Please take a current AA map. The "Queenstown Dunedin Invercargill" touring map is best.** Drive on from Reids', several km, and take the **Lee Flat Rd** on the left. (Mahinerangi Road, though sealed, is unpleasantly corrugated) Turn Lt at Lee Flat and continue on Lee Flat Rd until you come on to Mahinerangi Rd. Turn Rt and then keeping Lt, drive down past the fishing huts and across the Edgar Stark bridge over the lake. 1 km up the hill is a T junction - turn Rt into Waipori Rd and continue for another km. Turn Lt at the crossroads into **Mitchells Flat Rd**.

Anne and Peter Shepherds' is the 2<sup>nd</sup> house on the RHS, about 6km along, Rpd 1087, with a stone gateway and trees. Drive up to the house. Apart from their home garden, they have planted a lot of trees, native and exotic, in areas all around their farm. You will be able to drive around it following Peter, with stops along the way. Anne has generously offered to give us afternoon tea, so bring your cups and we shall enjoy a break before returning home via Waitahuna. *Noelene*

#### New Zealand International Rhododendron Conference 2014

The conference programme has been finalised. Details and registration forms are available from the NZRA website <u>www.rhododendron.org.nz</u> or from the Conference Registrar, Tony Fitchett.

Local members do not need to join the NZRA in order to attend. It is a 5 day programme including speakers (local and international), bus tours to garden visits, dinners and a banquet. Early registration is available at \$455. As an alternative it is possible to register for just the lectures; there being two on the Tuesday morning and two on the Wednesday morning. The \$60 fee covers all four lectures and morning tea on both days.
