South African bulb, hardy with tall spike of hanging yellow bell shaped flowers in January.

C204 Caloscordum neriniflorum

11.00

30 cm bulb from Mongolia with loose umbels of bright pink flowers in Jan/Feb.

C205 Camellia trichocarpa

16.50

White flowers with yellow stamens in mid to late winter, with a beautiful cinnamon coloured bark.

C206 Chimonanthus nitens

11.00

Related to Wintersweet with creamy white strap like scented flowers in winter, evergreen with shiny leaves, grown from seed ex Chengdu, China.

C207 Corylus colurna

11.00

Turkish hazel. Eventually a medium sized tree with edible nuts.

C208 Cyphomandra betacea

11.00

Tamarillo. Relatively cold hardy, if you wish to grow a tamarillo in Dunedin this is your best bet. Ripens to orange with orange sweeter flesh.

C211 Hebe chathamica

11.00

Low growing ground cover Hebe from Chathams. Will flow down banks or walls, white flowers with a hint of mauve on petal edges in spring/summer.

C210 Hebe dieffenbachii

11.00

Shrub from Chatham Island. Grows to 2 m with mauve fading to white flowers in Spring.

C212 Hebe speciosa

16.50

This has the largest leaves of any Hebe, with magenta flowers in winter. 2x2 m.

C213 Hovenia dulcis

22.00

Japanese Raisin Tree. Deciduous to 10 m. Flower stalks are edible and taste similar to raisins hence the name.

C214 Illicium majus

11.00

Evergreen shrub, a member of the Star Anise family. Dark green shiny evergreen leaves with strap like cream flowers in late winter, highly scented as are the aromatic leaves. 3 m.

C215 Luzula nivea

11.00

Snowy Woodrush. Perennial grass like plant, forms clumps in garden with whitish heads of flowers in spring and brown seed heads, both of which are attractive.

C216 Pinus densiflora 'Umbraculifera'

11.00

Slow growing, multi-stemmed dwarf selection of Japanese red pine. Has long dark green needles. 2 m.

C217 Piper excelsum

11.00

Was Macropiper. Kawakawa, a native shrub to 2 m likes shade. This is a hybrid between Piper Melchior from Three Kings Island and Piper excelsum so has large leaves and some texture to leaves.

C209 X Didrangea versicolor

11.00

Was Dichroa. Evergreen hybrid with hydrangea, has deep blue star like flowers over most of the year.

A plant I had many years ago from the late Jack Scott of Pine Hill. Similar to a normal bright pink bergenia but only some 10 cms in height including the flower stems. We have it beautifully moulded over a rock as tightly as any high alpine plant.

L061 Dactylorhiza maculata

8.80

The ever popular hardy ground orchid with spotted leaves and many small man-like flowers in deep pink, up stems to about 40 cms in height. Clumps up nicely and has the advantage of being in bloom up to and through Christmas and New Year. Loves a damp place.

L062 Galanthus reginae-olgae

PB3/4

7.70

The lovely autumn flowering snowdrop which flowers from about March through to the first winter 'drops. Snowdrops are very "in" at present but supply is an ongoing problem. Potted in January.

L068 Hacquetia epipactis

PB3/4

7.70

A plant which always intrigues as it appears to have green flowers. In fact, the stem carries a small central bunch of tiny yellow flowers and this bunch is surrounded by a bright green "ruff." It likes a cool, damp spot and is a favourite of every rock-gardener. Winter dormant.

L063 Hosta 'Blue Arrow'

4

12.10

A wonderful blue with sharply pointed leaves growing outwardly to a lovely clump about 35 cms in height and twice as wide within 4 or 5 years. Lilac flowers in summer. Ex garden.

L065 Hosta 'Hadspen Blue'

4

12.10

One of the world's best-known varieties famous for its blue, bloom-like leaves, strongly heart-shaped and thick-textured, so slug and snail-resistant (as are most modern hostas). Ex garden.

L066 Hosta 'Krossa Regal'

PB2

9.90

A big, bold variety growing to 80 cms if happy in a damp place. Large leaves are bluish-grey and puckered on strong tall stems.

L067 Hosta 'Royal Standard'

9.90

Similar to 'Krossa Regal' but greener rather than blue-grey. Like KR it makes a big clump, ideal for beside a pond or anywhere really damp. Ex garden.

L064 Hosta fortunei 'Albo-picta'

9.90

A favourite for its bright, pale yellow inner leaves, finely edged in green. The yellow deepens over late spring and summer but still is differentiated from the green. Vigorous, growing to a good clump about 40 cms in height and twice as wide. Lilac flowers in summer. Ex garden.

L069 Iris sibirica 'Moonsilk'

9.90

An older variety of the moisture-loving Siberian iris but the best yellow form, the standards light yellow and the flaring falls a strong butter shade. Not so tall at about 70 cms in bloom which is generous. Great picking too. Ex garden.

L070 Iris sibirica 'Penny Whistle'

9.90

A taller form with slender stems of heavily veined and lined flowers, mainly blue with white markings and a little crimson in there too. Ex garden.

L071 Narcissus 'Susan Cox'

11.00

My own registered hybrid between Narcissus 'Gambas' and N. cyclamineus. Growing to about 9 cms at maturity it has a slim trumpet (corona) and swept-back petals (corolla) for all the world like Piglet in a high wind. Pure golden yellow it has become a prize winner at many national shows

(best miniature daffodil) and is now performing in the UK and the USA where it is MUCH more expensive than here! Perfect in garden, pot or trough and flowers in Aug/September. Potted in 90 mm square plastic pots.

| | An easy and beautiful ground cover which sparkles with a crop of pure white flowers over roundish greenery. I grew it from an Australian friend's seed and am always surprised that so many people seeing it for the first time just MUST have it. | | | |
| L074 | Persicaria macrocephala 'Red Dragon' | | PB5 | 9.90 |
| | Although it has pretty bunches of white flowers through summer, this is grown mainly for its beautifully marked foliage, red with arrows of green, grey and silver following the shape of the leaf outline. Can make a tall plant but I cut mine to ground level each winter for freshly minted leaves in spring. | | | |
| L073 | Philadelphus coronarius 'Aureus' | 2 | PB2 | 11.00 |
| | Bright golden foliage on an ultimately tallish shrub, for a cool place in some shade. A wonderful plant to lighten a dark corner and the creamy flowers are delightfully scented. Deciduous. | | | |
| L078 | Physocarpus populifolius 'Dart's Gold' | | PB2 | 9.90 |
| | Another golden shrub which will grow big in time. Beautiful foliage and flowers of the same colour. Best in a place with some but not full sun. | | | |
| L075 | Podophyllum hexandrum, Coral pink | 6 | PB3/4 | 11.00 |
| | You will likely know the lovely white form of this plant with flowers which sit on a mottled, umbrella-like leaf as it emerges through the soil. I am able to offer a few of a form with coral pink flowers, grown from Dave Toole's seed. Similar foliage and likewise, the beautiful, large and squashy tomato-coloured fruit which hangs below the leaf as it matures and ripens. 3 years old, probably to flower in 2020. | | | |

| | In effect, a larger version of the diminutive Polygonatum hookeri, a well-beloved rock garden plant. Growing to about 13 cms in height, the leaves are a little longer and narrower and the flowers are larger but of the same dusty, pinky, plummy shade. | | | |
| L077 | Polygonatum humile | | PB2 | 8.80 |
| | A great ground cover creeping to a thick and weed-suppressing mat from little white rhizomes. Glossy greenery supports small green and white flowers. Deciduous but still weed-suppressing even when dormant in winter. | | | |
| L079 | Primula auricula, Red shades | | PB3/4 | 4.40 |
| | The old Dusty Miller primula, homely and beautifully scented. These varying reds are all seedlings from a white-flowered plant so their own seedlings may be of great interest. | | | |
| L080 | Primula florindae, Rusty red | 6 | PB3/4 | 6.60 |
| | The tall and elegant Primula florindae normally has plain yellow flowers but these seedlings from Scottish Rock Garden Club have all flowered in a deep, rusty red shade, most with pale yellow farina inside the bell-shaped flowers. Loves a damp place and will grow to 80 cms if happy. Deliciously scented, winter dormant. | | | |

Beautiful in any wide border or collection of shrubs but especially if espaliered on a wall or fence. Deciduous. In flower it is an instant star. | | | |

| | I was told about Viola 'Blue Jeans' as a great plant to grow but when I bought one found it was V. 'Jean's Blue.' A thick rug-like plant, low and bright green with a cover of smallish flowers, strongly coloured in blue-violet. A quick trim over now and then keeps the flowers coming almost indefinitely. 100 mm square plastic pots. | | | |
| L083 | Weldenia candida | | PB2 | 8.80 |
| | Purest white and pristine flowers over chunky greenery make up one of the most choice plants every offered in New Zealand. From my own 1993 importation, this Mexican plant is hardy here, with a thick tuberous root which dies down for winter, and re-emerges in mid spring to start blooming in October. Loves the sun in a well-drained soil or large pot. | | | |

0084 Anemone pulsatilla (Pulsatilla vulgaris)

6.60

A hardy easy-to-grow pulsatilla in mauve with finely cut leaves and fluffy seedheads, combines well with spring bulbs. 90 mm.

0085 Aquilegia flabellata "Nana alba"

6.60

An outstanding dwarf variety of Asian columbine that grows in partial shade in a rock garden or towards the front of a small border. It forms a clump of grey-green leaves, said to evoke a geisha's fan. This is a compact perennial which forms a mound 13-18 cms tall that produces short-spurred, nodding white flowers late spring to early summer. 90 mm.

0087 Erythronium "Pagoda"

8.80

Creamy yellow flowered erythronium that is a cross between E. tuolumnense and E. californicum "White Beauty". Slightly mottled leaves and summer dormant. A bright spot in spring time and very reliable. 120 mm.

0086 Erythronium tuolumnense

(Dog Tooth Violet, although not a violet). Large glossy, wavy green leaves with nodding rich yellow flowers. Grows into a very nice clump. 120 mm.

0088 Gentian asclepiadea

Vigorous shoots on stems that generally arch elegantly outward from the base of the plant between 60-90 cm. Trumpet shaped, deep blue flowers occur in late summer into autumn. 90 mm.

0089 Glaucidium palmatum album
